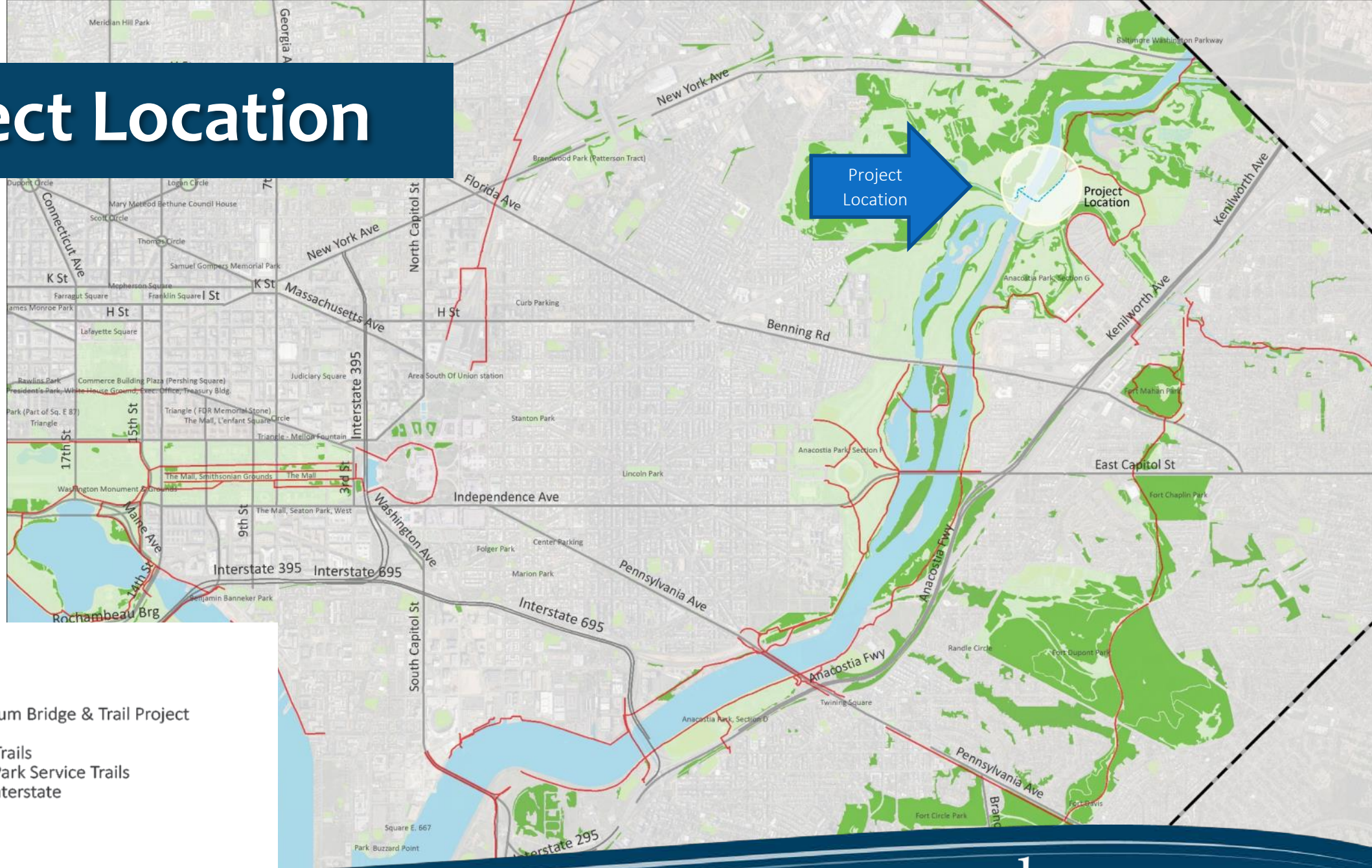

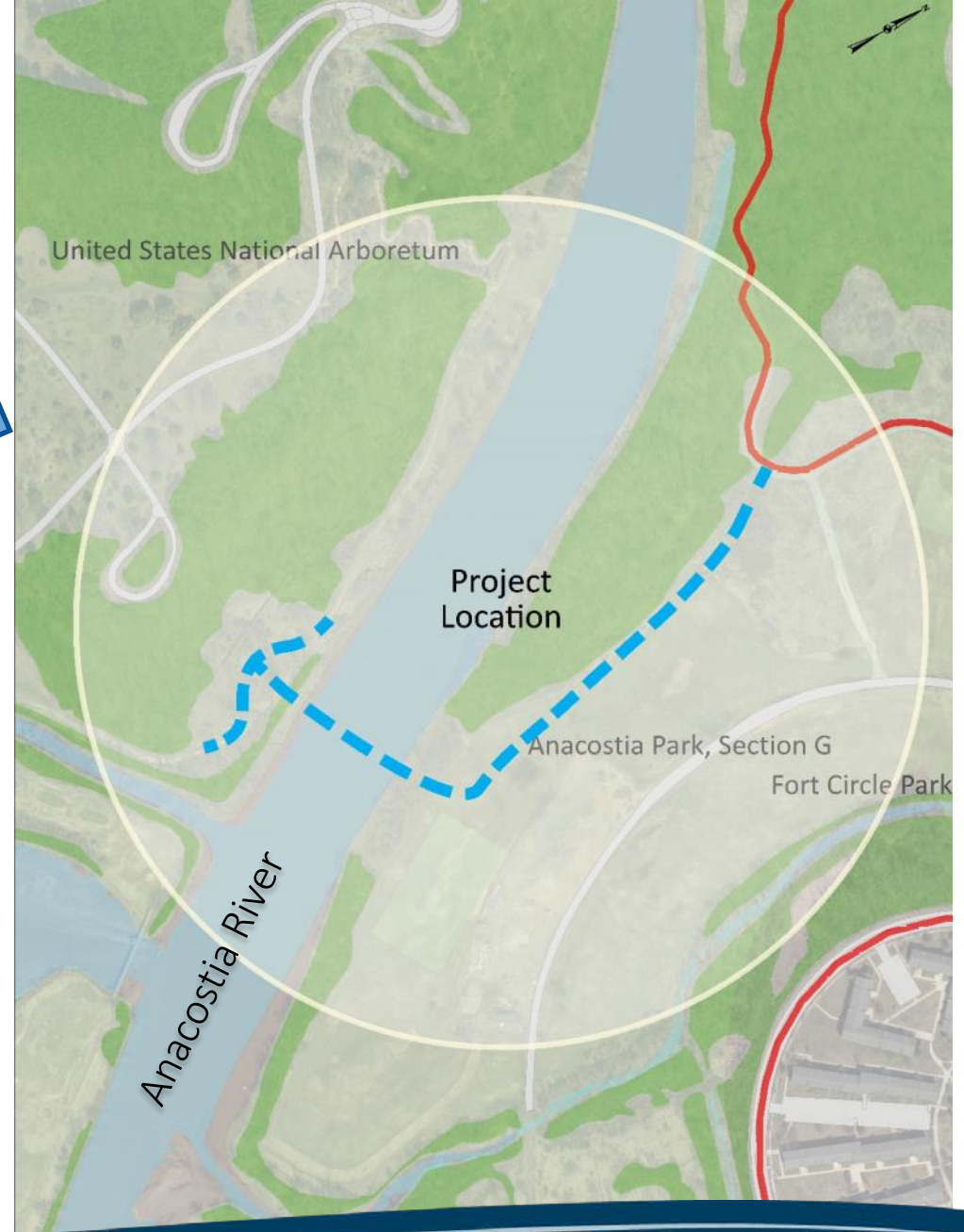
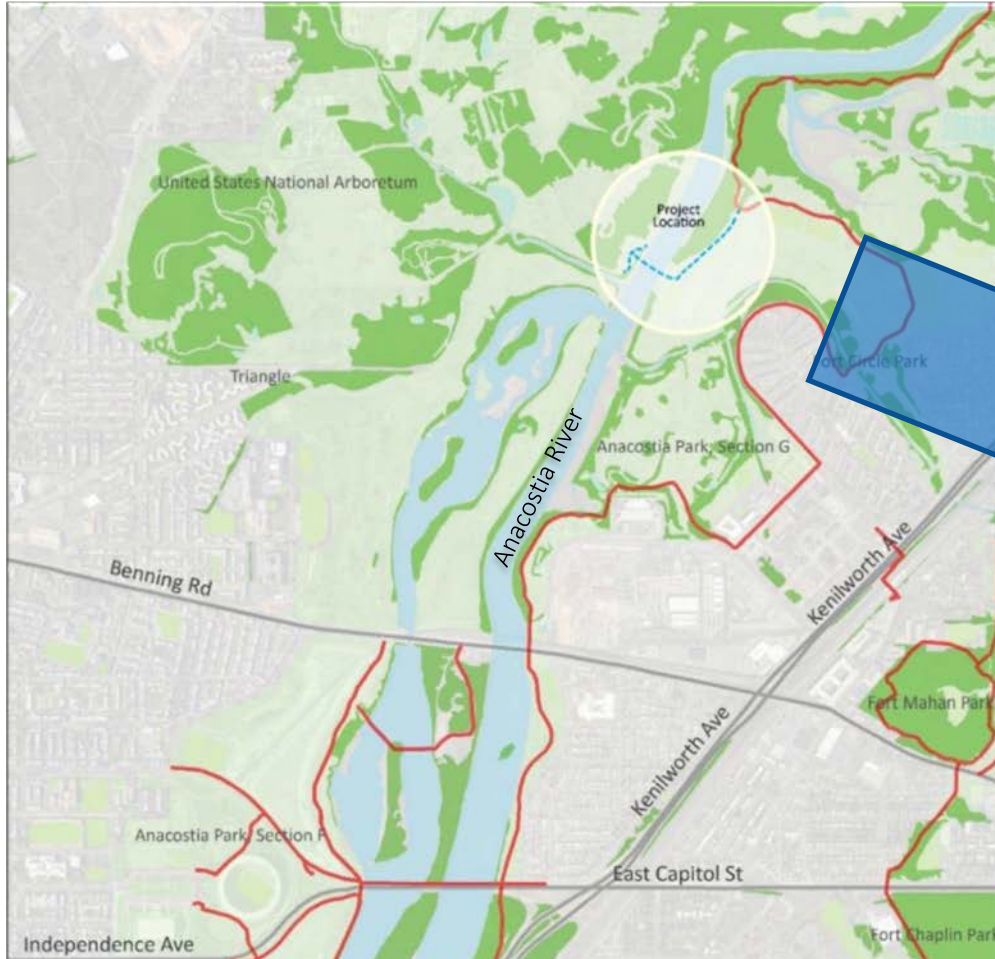


- ◆ 30-Year Initiative

Project Location



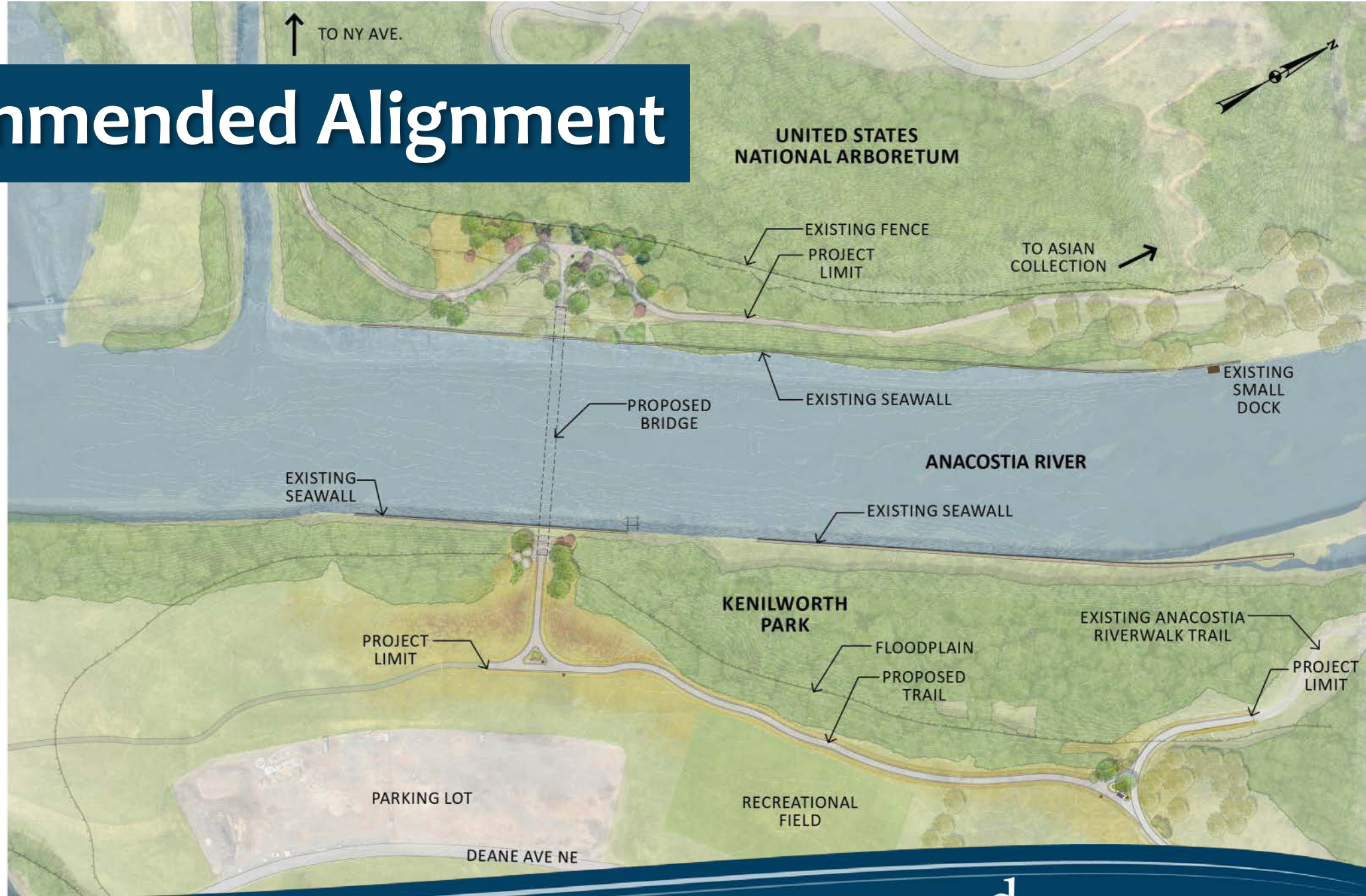

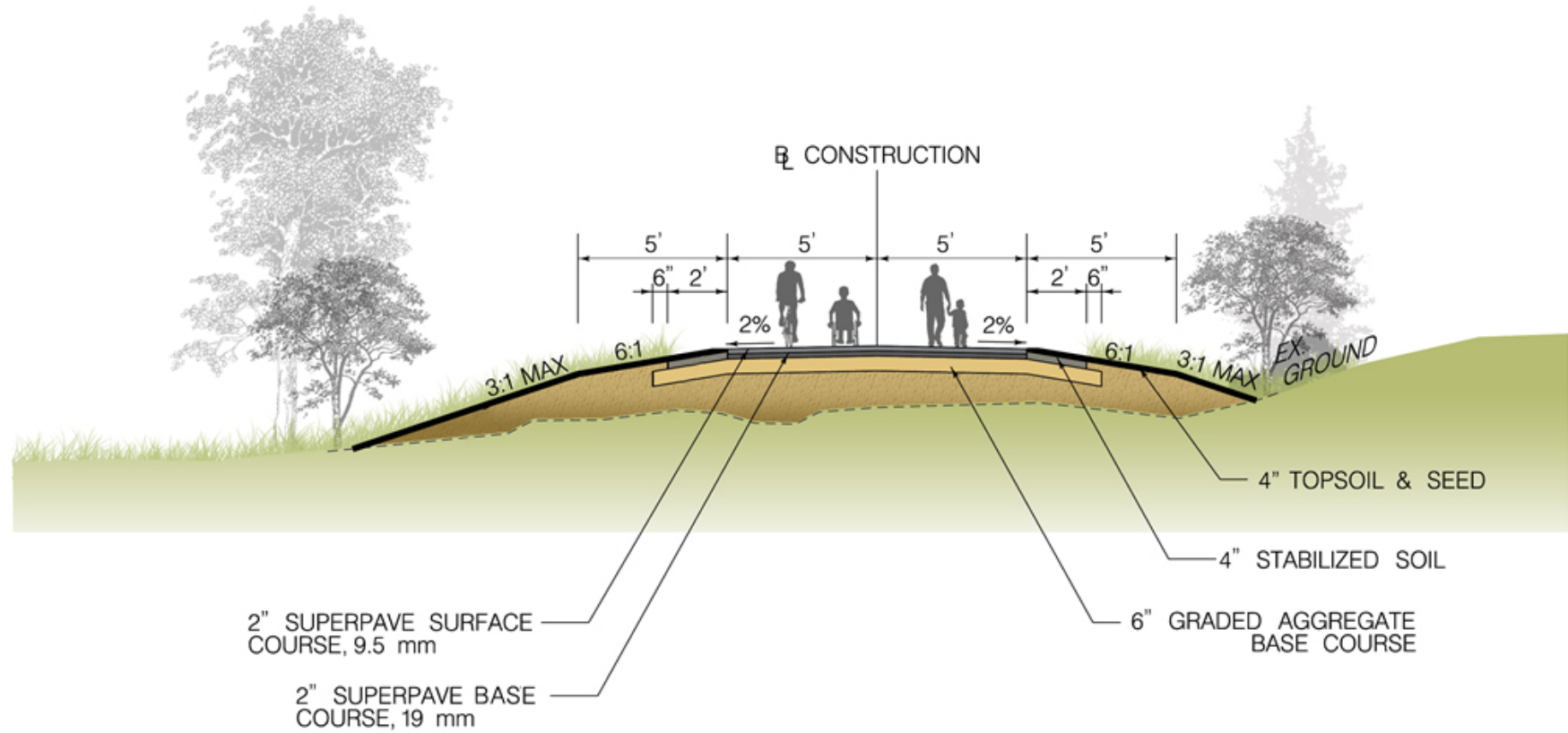

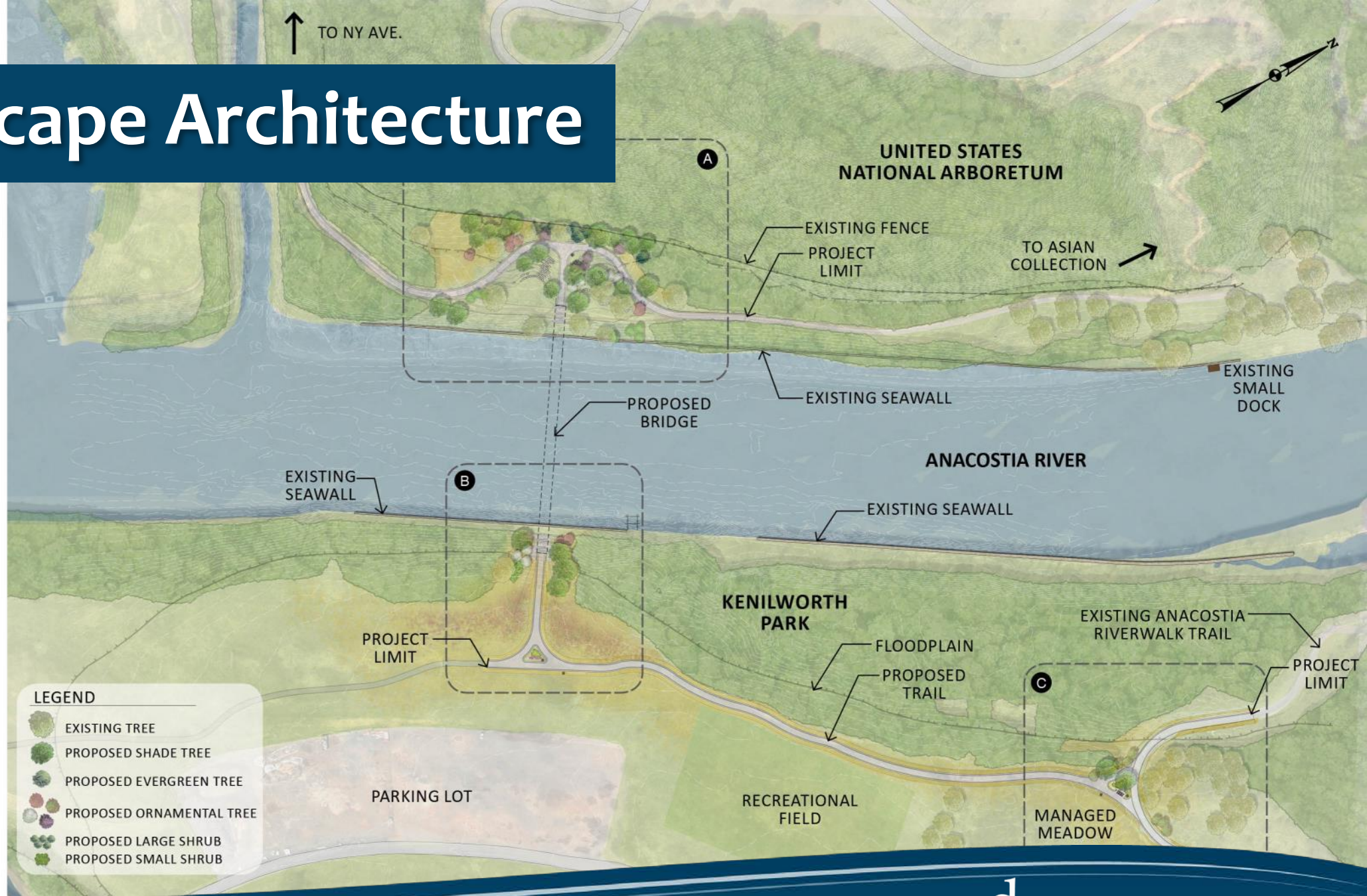

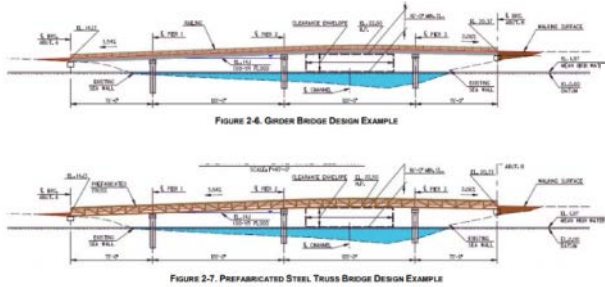

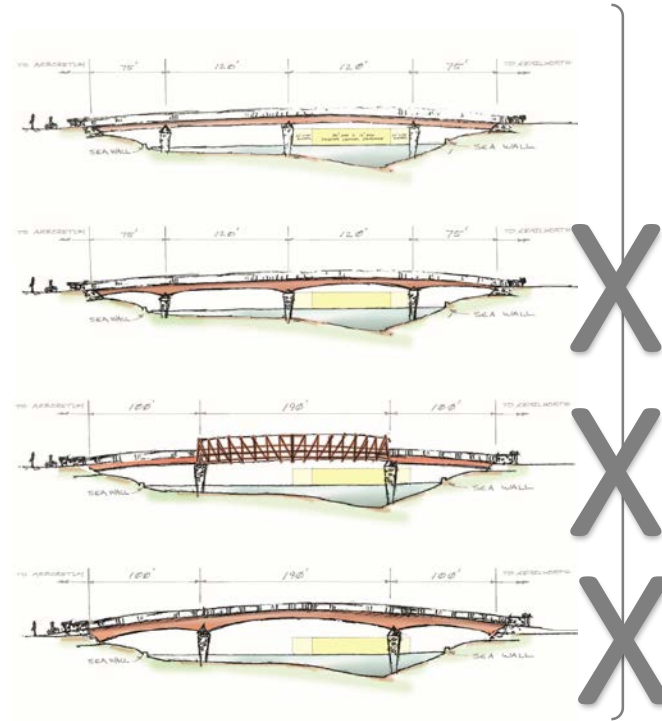

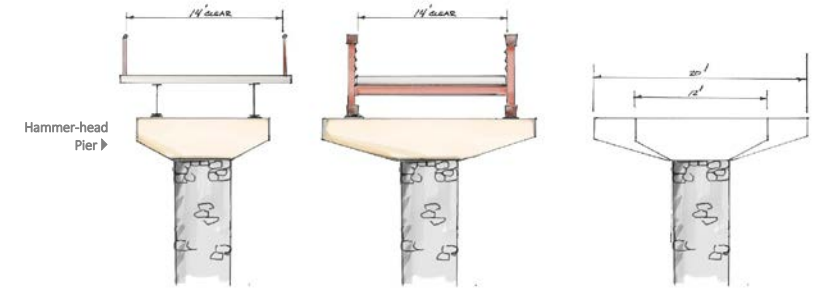

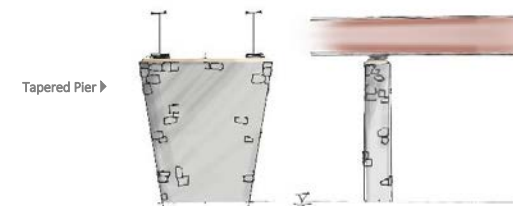
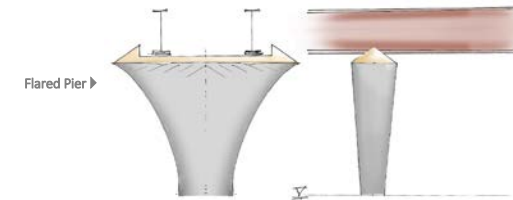
